Can you believe our BV Firefighters only get \$8.90/hr!

At their September meeting the Bennett Valley Fire Protection District Board of Directors agreed to give their firefighting engineers a 10% pay increase, bringing their starting salaries up to \$8.90 per hour. This is just slightly more than one-half of the starting salaries for the following Fire Protection Districts: Cloverdale, Gold Ridge, Healdsburg, Rancho Adobe, Rincon Valley, Valley of the Moon and Windsor. As a comparison, someone answering the phone at a McDonald's restaurant is paid \$6.35/hr. Our Fire District is also one of few volunteer firefighting districts that currently does not give their volunteers any subsidy for meals when they spend the night on duty at the Fire Station. This usually includes two to four volunteers every night.

Why do we pay our valuable firefighters so little? As Joe Stans, the Bennett Valley Assistant Fire Chief puts it, "We are currently struggling to operate a \$500,000 fire district on about \$300,000 and find ourselves falling farther and farther behind." In the last issue of the VOICE Joe Stans and the Bennett Valley Volunteer Firefighters Association expressed gratitude for all the contributions received from the Community through Community Day and the Silent Auction; however these funds are being used for the new fire engine and can't begin to pay such necessary operating costs as staffing salaries and volunteer subsidies.

Does our Administrative Agreement with the Gold Ridge Fire District save us money? Yes! The budgets of the Bennett Valley Fire Protection District and the Gold Ridge Fire Protection District are completely separate, but Bennett Valley is

saving a considerable amount of money on administrative services and equipment purchases.

Again, per Joe Stans, "This Agreement has saved the BV Fire District thousand of dollars and will continue to do so. However, it is impossible to realize sufficient future savings to meet the State and Federal mandates and ongoing financial needs." Besides staffing and salaries, fiscal problems at the Bennett Valley Fire Station include building and equipment maintenance (for the thirty year old building), ongoing equipment replacement and the cash reserves necessary to avoid borrowing from the County (with interest) between tax collections. These fiscal difficulties could also end up **significantly increasing our homeowner insurance rates in Bennett Valley.**

What is the best answer to these fiscal dilemmas? The Bennett Valley Fire Protection District serves Bennett Valley as well as some other outlying areas, such as Holland Heights and parcels off Petaluma Hill Rd. and Warrington Rd. Residents in areas served by the Bennett Valley Fire Station need to get together during this next year to learn more about possible alternatives and reach mutual decisions about what we all are willing to support.

The Bennett Valley 2002 Community Forum, scheduled for Saturday, 2/02/02 (8:30 am to 12 noon at the Bennett Valley Grange Hall) will discuss this local fire funding issue in-depth. In February and March of 2002, there will also be a number of smaller neighborhood meetings or contacts to discuss Bennett Valley Fire District funding. Your input will be welcome.

Water Committee Requests Your Help!

Bennett Valley zoning density was implemented partially in response to concerns about limited availability of water in the Valley. The Valley has seen steady growth in residences and agriculture (mainly vineyards). Valley residents have a diverse range of views regarding the effect of additional vineyards on the supply of water.

Questions continue regarding how much water the Valley has in its aquifers and from rainfall. A number of people express this concern each year at the Bennett Valley Community Forum. **This year the Water Committee wants to create a Valley water record, but needs your help to do it.**

- 1.) If you have your well's original well drilling log, we'd like to use it to create a record of well depth and water levels throughout the Valley.
- 2.) If your well has a water level sounding tube, please let us know.
- 3.) If you've had a change in your well's water level or water yield, please give us the details.
- 4.) If you'd like to participate in measuring rainfall this winter with your rain gauge, give us a call.

We'll use this information to create a Valley Water Record and include it in the presentation at the Bennett Valley 2002 Community Forum. **Please help us: we need your personal information in order to gather the facts on the Valley water supply.** This will help give all residents a better understanding of Bennett Valley water concerns and how we can best plan for the future.

Information on Vineyard Water Usage

- 1.) Almost all of the mature vineyards in Sonoma county are dry farmed; that is, they are not regularly watered.
- 2.) New vineyards, or vineyards which are replanted to replace diseased rootstocks, are irrigated for the first four or five years. The irrigation is usually during the months of May through September. The rule of thumb is 6 gallons per vine per week. There are about 1,000 vines per acre, so the yearly water usage per acre is roughly 6 gallons times 1000 vines times 21 weeks, or 126,000 gallons. That is roughly the same as one household.
- 3.) Most vineyards in Sonoma County are set up for water spray frost protection. It is seldom used because the only frosts which are harmful are those which take place in the spring after the plants have started budding. For all except the smallest vineyards, this requires a pond, because the rate of flow is greater than well pumps can handle. Some of these ponds are fed by natural creeks, others are filled by wells, and many of the ones which are fed by creeks are replenished by wells. The rule of thumb here is 55 gallons per minute per acre, and the sprayers usually run for about four hours a night, or 13,200 gallons per night per acre.

What impact this water usage has on the surrounding water tables in Bennett Valley is unknown, at this time.

Grange Road Oak Trees/P.G.&E.

On 11/5/01 there was a meeting between PG&E staff and four Bennett Valley residents about the 125 Grange Road oak trees marked for possible removal. Under a mandatory tree removal program, PG&E has removed 9,000 trees in the North Bay, so far, and 2 million trees statewide. They are generally removing fast-growing trees, such as Bay and Eucalyptus trees, which have to be pruned frequently to keep them four feet away from the power lines. PG&E staff agreed that the oak trees on Grange Road are not fast-growing but they were considering removing them before they were identified with "Sudden Oak Death" and couldn't be moved away. They are reconsidering this approach and will examine it in greater detail with us.

Check out the BVHA Web Site!

For a long time Bennett Valley residents requested a BVHA Web Site for improved communication in the Valley. This year David Phillips did a great job of setting it up at <Bennettvalleyhomeowners.org>. While he is no longer on the BVHA Board of Directors, he is continuing as our coordinator for the web site.

This web site has a number of lovely pictures of Bennett Valley as well as information about the Bennett Valley Homeowners' Association, meetings, community events, local information, a forum, a copy of the Bennett Valley Area Plan, and copies of our bimonthly newsletter, the VOICE. In the section on "About Us", you can find our mission statement, how to become a member including a printable form and Bennett Valley history. There is a community calendar with event descriptions and dates, board meeting dates, and phone numbers and addresses for a bounty of commonly used services. There are sections where you can put in questions or comments you might have about local issues, such as about the Grange Road oak trees or the Bennett Valley Fire Protection District funding. Also, if you're interested in having an item included on the Agenda for the next Board meeting you can put that on the web site, under Agenda Items. If you have any questions about the BVHA web site, please call one of the Board members.

Street Naming/Address Signs

In the September VOICE, Joe Stans, the Assistant BV Fire Chief, discussed the County requirement concerning street-naming should a new residential unit be added to an existing driveway. In that article, he concluded that the Bennett Valley Fire District would be willing to request a variance to this ordinance if county standard address signs were used, both on the street, with all the addresses located along that driveway and then also at the particular driveway for each residence. He and Chief Kent Reynolds have since found out this is not possible. The system for naming driveways and streets is intended to allow the county to provide accurate information to all county agencies as well as State and Federal agencies in the event of a disaster. Fire Districts, after initial input some years ago, cannot request a variance to mitigate the conditions of this ordinance.

Matanzas Creek Watershed Group

There will be a fall quarterly meeting of the Matanzas Creek Community Stewardship group on Thursday, November 8th, from 7:00 to 8:30 pm at the Bennett Valley Grange Hall. By the time you read this, the meeting will have already occurred, as described in the September VOICE. Also, post cards have been sent out by Sotoyome Resource Conservation District (SRCD) to people who have requested to be kept on the active .list. On the postcards it states that Steve Brady, Environmental Specialist for the City of Santa Rosa Public Works Department, will give a presentation on monitoring and restoration activities occurring in Matanzas Creek. Winter monitoring activities including reading rain gauges and creek flow stations will also be discussed and rain gauges will be provided to interested parties. If you are interested in being notified about future meetings, be sure to get your name on the active list by calling Sierra Cantor at 569-1448.

We're still having a problem getting access permission from landowners along Matanzas Creek in the Bennett Valley area for the three possible "study reach" areas which have been identified. Some of the landowners have responded to the "Landowner Access Authorization Agreement" which was sent to them, but most of them have not. If you have any ideas or questions about this, please contact Marilee Jensen at 576-0405.

On Friday, October 19th, the Sotoyome Resource Conservation District held an "Awareness Day" luncheon meeting and a tour of some of their restoration sites. Attending this meeting were a number of the volunteers who have worked with the Conservation District and legislative representatives from the offices of Wes Chesbro, Lynn Woolsey and Mike Cale. The program included information about the Russian River Creek Stewardship Program, fish friendly farming and the Gualala River Watershed. There was a special recognition for two cooperators, Simi Vineyards & Winery and the Gualala Redwoods, Inc. Also a number of volunteers were recognized, including Marilee Jensen from BVHA. The tour of restoration sites included the bank stabilization along Turtle Creek and Simi Vineyards to see the removal of invasive species and revegetation with native plants—a good example of some of the work SRCD has been doing.

After previewing the Valley, it was determined that the litter needed to be picked up in the following areas; Bennett Valley Road, Grange Rd./Crane Canyon and Sonoma Mountain Rd. up to LaGrande Ave. People worked at picking up litter from 8:30 am until about noon, with coffee and donuts available in the BV Fire Station Parking lot. The Sonoma Co. Public Works litter crew has agreed to do the precarious parts of Bennett Valley Rd., from the oak trees up to Warm Springs Rd., by 11/16/01,

Included with the 20 to 30 bags of trash which were picked up, there were (as usual) many tires, lots of footage of drip system hose, hub caps, numerous cans of whipped cream, dead raccoons and one live dog. The dog was running loose on Bennett Valley Road for at least 30 minutes, almost causing a number of accidents as well as endangering his own life, so he was delivered by two volunteers to his fenced-in backyard in Woodside.

Thanks to all the volunteers for making Bennett Valley a little cleaner. We only have four pick-up sticks now, but we're exploring ways to have enough for all the volunteers by next time. It makes the job a lot easier and even safer. We're tentatively planning the Spring Clean-Up Day for Saturday, April 20th, so watch for more information in the March VOICE. New BVHA Board of Directors

As described in the "Report on the BVHA Board Meetings", on page 5, we have three new Directors on the Board of Directors, as of the last meeting on October 17th.

Bill Sullivan was on the BVHA Board of Directors since June 1994, when he was one of two appointees to replace two directors who had resigned. Bill was on the Board for over seven years and was President for five of those years - probably the longest span of any BVHA President. He felt that he had "stood up and taken his turn" for Bennett Valley and did not choose to run for another three-year term. We certainly appreciate all that Bill has contributed to the Bennett Valley community.

Nancy Dell'Ergo, the Treasurer, served on the BVHA Board of Directors for two terms and didn't choose to run for another three-years. We very much appreciate her significant contributions to BVHA and as well as her willingness to serve for six years.

Michael Friedenbergs was appointed to the BVHA Board about one year ago but didn't feel he had the available time to make another three-year commitment. Nevertheless he was willing to serve for one more year; so, he agreed to complete the one year term of David Phillips, who had resigned in August. Michael has been another very valuable BVHA Board Member who has now been re-appointed as Vice-President for a second year.

One of the directors who had resigned when Bill Sullivan was appointed, in June, 1994, was Michael Bates. Helen Bates, his wife, is one of the new appointments who was willing to accept a three-year term. She has a lot of valuable experiences including some with accounting, and was willing to also accept the position of Treasurer. The other two new appointments are Jennifer Combs and Tim Murphy, both of whom are from Woodside and have been active on the Woodside water board over the years. It's nice to have three new members on the BVHA Board of Directors. We really want to express our appreciation to these new Board members who were willing to join us as we move into 2002.

31st Anniversary for the BVHA

On December 6th, 1970 the first Board of Directors appeared before a notary public to sign the Articles of Incorporation for the Bennett Valley Homeowner's Association; Walter Benson, Ash Cuchin, Paul Hamilton, William Jacobs, Bradford W. Lundborg, Paul Mowbray, Charles Nunnemaker, William Pisenti and David Sandine.

In 1970 a possible mobile home park in Woodside and ¼ acre home lots near the fire house were threatening the rural atmosphere of the area. Could Bennett Valley be saved? A group of residents held meetings at the Grange to discuss the future of the Valley and formed the Bennett Valley Homeowner's Association in order to protect and preserve the rural scenic character of Bennett Valley. The Articles of Incorporation were signed by the Secretary of State, Edmond G. Brown, on 6/1/71.

In 1972, at the behest of the BVHA, a first attempt was made at the county level to reduce the impacts of residential development in Bennett Valley. An initial plan was drawn up with provisions reducing growth and protecting the environment for agricultural and residential land use. By 1977 it was clear that this first attempt at a plan, although a great stride forward, was inadequate. The Board of Supervisors then established a 15,5000 acre Bennett Valley Study district and appointed an eleven-person BV Citizens' Committee. Their goal was to develop a policy framework to provide residential opportunities and protect agriculture while retaining the rural character and natural environment of Bennett Valley. Through this process the 1978 Bennett Valley Specific Plan came into being.

In 1989, the Board of Supervisors adopted an update of the above plan, to reduce any redundancy or conflict with the Sonoma County General Plan, but the revision preserved the full spirit and intent of the original plan of 1978, now referred to as the Bennett Valley Area Plan. As stated in this revision, "Should there be any future questions regarding the intent or basis of the policies in the revised plan, the Planning Department shall keep copies of the original plan on file for reference." The key elements of this Plan can be found in the Bennett

Valley pamphlet (recently mailed to you). You may also receive a copy of the Bennett Valley Plan through the web-page or the BVHA President. Following is a review of the Presidents and some other members of the Board of Directors over the past 31 years, as gleaned through the available copies of the Bennett Valley VOICE, which was first started in January 1978. If you have different information, please be sure to let the Editor know.

Of the original founding directors, Brad Lundborg and Paul Mowbray both served as President, with Brad Lundborg being the first President. Paul continued to serve on the Board for 15 years (until 10/86). Although Bill Jacobs was never President of BVHA, he served on the Board from 1970-1988. In between Brad Lundborg and Paul Mowbray, Cindy Lyddell was President for a period of time.

Max Moberly was President around 1978, until Tamara Boultee became President in 10/79. She was President for four years (until 10/83) and she also stayed on the BVHA Board for 15 years (until 10/94). The Presidents between 1983 and 1992 were Warren Watkins, David Steiner (twice), Bill MacIver, Terry Babineaux, Bill Wright and Kevin McCarthy, for one or two years each. After being the Editor of the VOICE for three years, Lois Brown was President from 1992 until 1995. Bill Sullivan was then President of BVHA for five years (10/95 until 10/00) - the longest serving President, it seems.

Other people who've served on the Board recently for a significant period of time include Nancy Batson, who was on the Board for two decades, from 1974 until 1994, Ray Longman from 10/95 until 9/00 and Eve Boling, who served as co-Editor and/or Editor of the VOICE during her two terms on the Board, from 10/93 until 10/99. Marilyn Stocks was elected to the Board in 10/94 and is now serving her third term (until 10/93). There were many more Board members who have not been named, but thanks so much to each and every one of them. It is hoped that looking back on the 31 years will inspire all of us to continue to work to maintain Bennett Valley as this very special community.

Report on the BVHA Board Meetings

The Board of Directors Agenda for each meeting is posted on a bulletin board at the BV Fire Station at least 72 hours prior to the meeting. The agenda includes a brief description of items for proposed action or discussion, and information on the scope of the proposed action. Please note that the November BVHA meeting is on the second Wednesday of the month, November 14th and there will be no meeting in December.

September 19th, 2001: Board members present at this meeting were Bobbie Blair, Nancy Dell-Ergo, Michael Friedenberg, Marilee Jensen, Lolly Mesches, Marilyn Stocks and Bill Sullivan, plus six other Bennett Valley residents. During Public Input, Michael Cronin suggested that BVHA donate the money needed for the cost of an election to increase the parcel tax allocated to the BV Fire District. Marilee then mentioned a Citizens' Committee meeting regarding the fire funding issue planned for Oct. 4th; those in attendance were encouraged to attend. The Treasurer's report was presented and minutes were approved.

The Bennett Valley calendar is ready to go to the printer. Eighty-five calendars have already been ordered and 300 calendars are being printed (see page 7). Three positions on the BVHA Board of Directors came up for re-election in September, as they do every year, but none of the incumbents were willing to run for another three-year term and no new candidates came forward. Also another Board member, David Phillips, had resigned from the Board at the August 15th meeting.

As reported in the last issue of the VOICE, PG&E had marked 125 oak trees with blue paint along Grange Road, for possible removal, "so they wouldn't be a continuous problem". Two engineers who had been asked to look at the oak trees couldn't believe that PG&E had anything to do with it, as these trees seemed to present no threat to the PG&E lines or the transmission of power to Bennett Valley. Sonoma County discovered that this tree removal on their County easement had been approved erroneously and they withdrew their approval on August 17th, 2001. PG&E will be re-evaluating the situation in November. (See page 2) Michael Friedenberg ended the meeting with a question about when he would be able to receive the VOICE on the BVHA web-page. The November VOICE will be on <bennettvalleyhomeowners.org>.

October 17th, 2001: All of the current Board members were present at this meeting which

included Bobbie Blair, Nancy Dell-Ergo, Michael Friedenberg, Marilee Jensen, Jim Katon, Lolly Mesches, Marilyn Stocks and Bill Sullivan, plus nine other Bennett Valley residents. Nancy Dell-Ergo gave her Treasurer's Report and turned over all of the pertinent records, as this was her last meeting as a Board member.

Michael reported on the Citizens' Committee Meeting held on the 4th of October to discuss local fire funding (see page 1). Marilee brought up all the improved road markings which Public Works had recently placed along Bennett Valley Road, including both the center markers and newly-painted lines in various places from Warm Springs Road to Galvin Park. The Board agreed that we would write a thank-you letter to John Maitland, the Road Maintenance Supervisor, for making the road so much safer. The BV 2002 Community Forum meeting is scheduled for 2/02/02 and the next planning meeting will be at 7 pm, on Thurs., Nov. 15th at the BV Grange Hall. Phil Temko mentioned his concerns about a well being drilled and was asked to relay his concerns to Ken Mesches, who was holding a water committee meeting on October 18th, in preparation for the BV 2002 Community Forum. Compliments and requests continue to come in for the Bennett Valley pamphlets, which have also now been mailed to forty prominent real estate brokers identified by Michael Friedenberg.

The last order of business on the agenda was the appointment of four candidates to the BVHA Board of Directors by the President, which required the approval of the majority of the Board, per the Bylaws. Michael Friedenberg was appointed to the one-year term vacated by David Phillips. Helen Bates, Jennifer Combs and Tim Murphy were all BVHA voting members who had expressed strong commitment to promoting and preserving the rural character and natural environment of Bennett Valley and agreed to a three-year appointment to the BVHA Board. The Board approved all four appointments unanimously. After the meeting was adjourned, the BVHA officers were selected by the Board, with Helen Bates as Treasurer. All the other officers stayed the same. (See page 7) Michael Friedenberg and Jim Katon then each suggested a different item for the November agenda; the Grange Road oak trees and the number of BVHA directors, respectively.
